The ISM national office has mailed ballots to all ISM "Regular" members which includes proposed bylaw changes that would (# 1) eliminate the Affiliate Support Council (ASC) and (# 2) establish an Affiliate, Groups & Forum Relations "Committee". The NAPM-C Board of Directors asks you to take the time to vote on this issue. We recommend that you vote **AGAINST** this proposal. If you do not vote or if you vote yes your vote will be counted "for" the elimination of the council. The Board of Directors feels that the elimination of the council will be detrimental to the affiliates and will cause the affiliates to have less representation. We feel this is not in the best long-term interest of ALL the affiliates in the ISM organization.

Four Louisville-area professional organizations- The Purchasing Management Association of Louisville (PMAL), The Kentuckiana Project Management Institute, The American Society for Quality (ASQ), and the American Production and Inventory Control Society (APICS)-have joined forces to present a unique, day-long professional development event called Regional Business Expo.

The keynote speaker is Tim Jarm, President and CEO of Jewish Hospital in Louisville, KY. Tim Jarm's presentation will focus on the business dynamics of the Healthcare industry and the strategies Jewish Hospital is employing to manage the "Perfect Storm" currently challenging the industry: the effects of costs, technological advancements, financial management issues and the perceived value of the consumer for the services received. He will discuss the business model changes required to take these elements into account without compromising service and quality. He will share how Lean Manufacturing and Six Sigma tools are being applied at Jewish Hospital to achieve this goal.

RBE 2007 will also feature 24 breakout sessions on topics including Project Management, Six Sigma, Customer Service, Career Development, Hiring, Business Intelligence, Process Mapping, Purchasing, and more! We will also have a Trade Show where attendees can learn about the latest tools and services to give your company the competitive edge
